## Parent Corner

Children learn and grow more during their first five years than any other time in their lives. As your baby becomes a toddler and

then a preschooler, he/she will go through many stages of development. Although children develop at their own pace, developmental milestones help you know what to expect as your child grows. When your child is screened, you will answer a set of questions tied to developmental milestones. These questions are designed to help you:

- Make sure your child's development is on track.
- Learn about how your child develops and what to expect as your child grows.
- Identify problems or concerns with your child's development as early as possible.
- Find additional support for your child, if needed.
- Discover ways you can support your child's next developmental steps.

While screening will not provide a diagnosis, if there are concerns with your child's development, it will indicate if your child needs further assessment. If there is a concern with your child's development, the earlier it is identified, the sooner your child will receive appropriate support and be able to develop and grow to their maximum potential.
