### CELEBRATE Dr. Seuss' Birthday Month with some fun activities:

#### Green Eggs and Ham

You can write rhyming words from the story on plastic Easter eggs. Split them apart and scatter them in a basket. Then have your child match the top and bottom of each egg together.

#### My Many Colored Days

Perfect for beginning writers. Each student cuts out and decorates a person in the color of their choosing. Then, they attach (with the help of an adult) a short sentence about what their color choice means to them and how it makes them feel.

#### One foot, Two Foot, Red Foot, Blue Foot

Help child trace their feet onto construction paper and then cut out their footprints. Have your child measure their footprint templates with Unifix Cubes, paper clips, or any other small objects. Compare lengths, talk about big/small, long/short, etc. Using their footprint templates, have them measure things around the room, such as bookcases, doors, windows, desks, etc.
